The United Benefice of the Wiske! It's our new name

On the 1st of October our name was changed, why add the word "united"? It was intended to be both a statement and an intention of where we are heading.

We are a group of 4 Church Councils, 5 Churches 8 Villages and lots of hamlets and



countryside, yet we are also all part of the same Benefice. That is a legal structure around the principal that we share our ministry and life together and have the same Rector and. The challenge for us is how do we make it work for the best. The temptation is to perhaps stay within our own village and church, keeping it going and hoping that it will perhaps flourish. Or we can recognise that we are part of something a little bit bigger and that it may help us in our hopes.

I think we need to be clear about what we mean by united, it doesn't mean uniform, everything the same, nor is it intended to somehow replace what is done in each village and church. I like to think that being united is perhaps a bit more like a sports team, each player brings their skills and weaknesses and are needed to play in differing roles, to help the team achieve a common purpose. Paul in 1 Corinthians 12 talks about us being a body made up of different parts, but each part important and with a function. He also goes on to observe that whilst we may not think our role is important it is none the less vital to the function of the whole.

Over the coming months and years, we will be exploring around what is it best to do together as a group and what is we do best locally, and how do we bring our gifts and skills to be blessing in our own community and across the wider benefice.

Each of us is important in this journey, in the ways we are generous and open with each other, in the ways we support and care not just in our own church, but into our communities, across our 8 villages, and into the wider world. Setting out on this journey, implies the possibility of risks and mistakes, so my prayer is that God

will equip us with patience, flexibility, and a gentle

Sometimes I tend to take things to seriously, but I think this journey we are going on together is meant to be joyous and fun and made secure in the knowledge of God's Love and grace for each of us and all of us.

A new kind of Remembrance poppy - For the first time in 28 years, there is a new kind of poppy for Remembrance Sunday this year: it is plastic free. Director of the Poppy Appeal, Andy Taylor-Whyte explains: "We are very proud to introduce the plastic-free poppy. It will not only enable people to support our Armed Forces community but also continues the RBL's commitment to sustainability."

The new poppy has been three years in the development and making. The aim was to reduce the use of single-use plastic and to "be economical, sustainable, and less impactful to the environment." Also a 40% smaller carbon footprint, and made from "bespoke red and green paper." The plastic-free poppy will be available alongside remaining stocks of the current poppy, to reduce any waste of poppies already produced. Poppies containing single-use plastic can be returned to Sainsbury's stores for recycling.

Renowned composer 'thrilled' to write new Christmas carol for Church of England - This Christmas, the Church of England is inviting choirs across churches, schools, and communities to 'join the song' alongside one of the country's leading choral composers.

The 'song' is a new interpretation of 'The First Nowell.' It has been given a brand-new melody by the well-known composer Bob Chilcott and is the centrepiece of this year's Church of England Christmas focus: *Follow The Star: Join The Song*.

The C of E theme for 2023 highlights how singing can help draw people closer to God and one another, through the journey from Advent to Epiphany.

Bob Chilcott's most often performed pieces include *Can you hear me? A Little Jazz Mass*, and the *St John Passion*. His music has been recorded by The King's Singers, King's College, Cambridge, The Sixteen, Tenebrae and The BBC Singers, among other choirs and groups.

The carol is published by Oxford University Press and features as part of OUP's new edition of the favourite series, Carols for Choirs 6.

They also prioritise imagination, tolerance, and respect for others. But compared to earlier surveys, parents find it less important to teach a child to be unselfish.


